In addition to worship we will also be offering opportunities for adults to gather on Sunday mornings during the education time, 9:15 beginning Sunday October 4th.

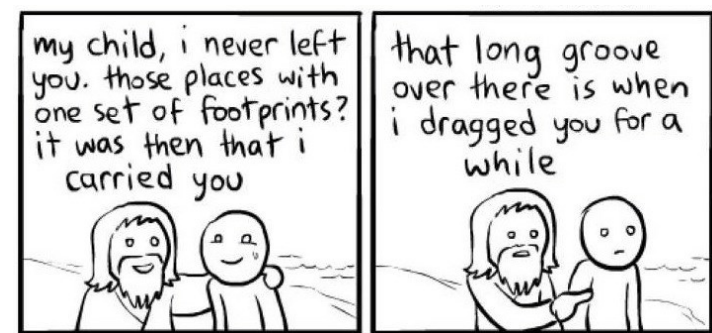

Prayer: Dear God, help us be good stewards of all you have provided. Give us discernment to know how and when to give, and keep our hearts open to our brothers and sisters. Amen

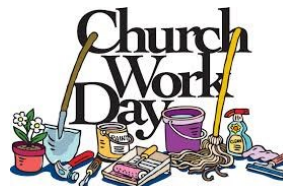
If someone uses my help when they don’t need it, that’s their problem. If I don’t give my help to someone who needs it, that’s my problem.

SKOGDALEN COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

OLD BUSINESS: After the last meeting, the shed was looked at and deemed to be in good shape; a new one is not needed. The restroom areas have been torn out. An overhead door is still needed, which hopefully can get done this fall. The trees will be trimmed after the leaves have fallen off. Krause has looked at needed tuckpointing and will send cost info to Nancy. Membership update letters were reviewed and a few revisions made. Council members will make note of who has been absent from church during the previous month and give them a call to let them know they’ve been missed.

NEW BUSINESS: We will have seminary student Josh Knutsen, from Arcadia once a month. Pastor John will be gone on September 6th; the service will be done entirely by lay people, with someone doing the sermon given by Bishop Arends at the Synod Assembly.

Meatball dinner will be Sunday, October 4. We will meet after church on August 30 to go over the list for supplies and workers.

Building Update: We will be having a congregational meeting next Sunday to vote on an official name change. When the constitution was translated into English during the 1930’s it was never recorded with the State.

Confirmation – orientation will be this Thursday and/or Sunday.

If God is enough -

There is the sound of lament in many parts of our church. Populations have shifted and people have drifted away. Attitudes about religion have changed and the status of the church in our culture has diminished. This makes us anxious and, in some cases, desperate. How do we stop the decline? Where is the next generation? What happened? What does this all mean?



I have a theory. We are experiencing God’s judgment. Oh, not in a fire-and-brimstone-plague-of-locusts kind of way, but in the tenacious, fearsome, loving claim that God has on all of us. *The church does not belong to us. The church is not a vehicle for our convenience, status, success or even comfort.* The church is the living body of Christ, breathed by the Spirit and called into deep communion with God. Everything else is at best supplementary and at worst a distraction.

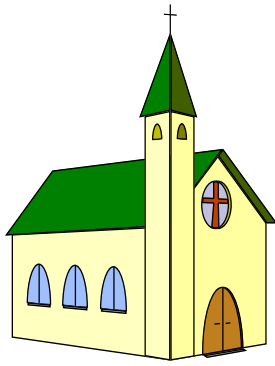
God might be calling God’s people to examine what has a claim on our attention. Where is our energy being drawn?

If the answer to our desperate questions is anything else than to the intimate and complete love of God shown in the crucified and risen Christ, then we are being drawn away from the source of our life as a people and as a church.

There was a provocative article in the December 2012 Christian Century that suggests that the church is relearning that its essence lies not in its programs and accomplishments, its activities and accolades, but in the truth that ‘she on earth hath union with God the Three in One’ and that God is enough. Coming to this knowledge means being weaned from the glamorous results-oriented American culture of production, measurement and unlimited growth.”

So, dear church, is God enough? If not, then we are consigned to an endless, exhausting and empty quest for meaning, relevance and purpose. If God is enough, then we have everything we need. If God is enough we are free to love in return and give our lives away for the sake of the gospel and in service to the neighbor. If God is enough we can unclench our hands and our lives. *If God is enough we can even let go of the church knowing that it is Christ’s church and not ours.*

And, if it is God’s will that there be an [ELCA](#) witness to the gospel, there is no force on earth, not even our own, that can stop it.
