

Stewardship is about more than money. But it is about money.

Your use of money and your other possessions are an important part of your discipleship as followers of Jesus. The word "steward" comes from the Anglo-Saxon term "sty warden," the person who took care of the pig sty! The term has evolved to describe anyone who is the keeper of another person's possessions. We're the keepers of God's possessions – that is of God's creation.

Steward describes your relationship with God the creator. It helps you to see that God has "created me and all that exists" (Luther's Small Catechism, Apostles' Creed, explanation of the First Article). And all that we are and all that we have, come from God as **blessing.** It is your responsibility to take care of and use wisely these blessings. They include your time, attention, physical health, energy, talents, possessions, attitudes, relationships, and money. That includes the sharing of your financial resources to support the ministry of the church.

Stewardship is about the abundance of God.

In many congregations thinking has become focused only on the congregation's budget. And so there can be a sense of not having enough to pay the bills. What this leads to is conversation about meeting the budget. It is based upon sacristy. When your use of language about stewardship is centered on the need to meet the budget of the congregation—the need to raise sufficient funds to cover the bills—you can lose sight of what it means to be good stewards. You might begin to think more about the total needed and "How much is my fair share?" You might find yourself wrestling with what you think you can afford to give in light of the rising costs of everything else in your life and how much you have left over. This way of very stewardship is based upon sacristy, rather than the abundance of God.

Stewardship as a Disciple of Jesus


Stewardship is an important daily activity in the life of a disciple of Jesus. He spoke

throughout the Gospels about money and possessions. (See Luke 12 as an example.) Mostly he warned about the power and ability of possessions to separate you from your relationship with God. Your possessions have the power to get in the way of your relationship with God. You might look to them for security, put your trust in them, and therefore treat them as idols worthy of wor-



ship. When we focus on our possessions they begin to possess us.

As a disciple of Jesus, you can find a broader role for stewardship in your daily life. You are called to be the body of Christ in the world—to do God's work, share your blessings received from God, do God's will. That understanding of stewardship is both about the congregation and the individual. How do you take care of all that God has blessed you with? How do you use those blessings to accomplish God's will for the world? This might mean tending to your health, your relationships, your work, your possessions, your finances, your recreation, God's creation, your congregation, your community, or your faith life. Building Renovation Update

Stained Glass Windows - Reinarts Stained Glass Studios will be working on some portions of our beautiful windows this fall and winter. They will be removing some of the bulges and re-sizing glass in a number of the windows in the sanctuary. Mark has completed the work on the exterior window frames.

Our Landscaping project is underway.

Tiffany Cade from Deep Rooted is designing the front

landscaping to ensure proper drainage and the selection of low maintenance and attractive plants. The major portion of the project will be completed this fall with the remainder in the spring.

Parking Lot/Dumpster Relocation. We will be relocating the dumpsters to an enclosed area near the kitchen door. The parking lot will be resurfaced this fall and depending upon the weather be stripped to allow for 21 parking spaces! No more blocking people in! We will be building a fence around the HVAC equipment on the south side later this fall or in the spring.

Front Step Railings - Work is still progressing on addressing the issues with the railings. Unfortunately there were a number of areas on the railings that were not properly treated.

FLOOD DAMAGE

On September 21-22, Sugar Creek experienced significant flooding throughout the camp.

Damage occurred to the front pasture fence, the new road coming into the camp, numerous large round bales of hay, gravel and road work, destruction of the cement floor in the shop, and water damage to some of the camp residences across the road.



Additionally, there were numerous tree and log debris from the creek spread throughout the camp.

The damage estimate from this flooding is between \$20,000 and \$22,000 at this time. This will include fencing, gravel, cement work, and water mitigation and equipment rentals (excavator, dozer work).

Our confirmation kids and adults went and helped out at the camp as part of their servant project. We will be taking a special offering for Sugar Creek on Sunday, October 9th. Saturday : Brunch – Large group fun – snacks, free time to enjoy all that Sugar Creek has to offer – supper—evening fun!




Sunday: Brunch - Large group fun - worship, head home or spend the rest of the day playing at camp!
