

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
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Our Savior's/Skogdalen Parish 306 S. Main St. Westby, WI 54667 Pastoral Perspectives Lenten Theme

Confession time. I have 13 crosses in my offices and over 15 at home. Over the years I have been given a number of crosses and I have added to the collection myself becoming a virtual cross hoarder in the process! I'm going to challenge the 3rd and 4th graders to count the number of crosses in our churches, whatever they come up with I will believe as I'd have a hard time counting that high.



Crosses are everywhere. Where have you seen crosses? Jewelry, cemeteries, roadsides, tattoos, logos, flags, clothing? In many ways it is an omnipresent symbol - yet, what does it mean?

My hunch is that most people have a really hard time finding the right words to talk about what the cross means. And when we do find the words they really can vary: suffering, liberty, love, freedom, safety, promise, hope, second-chance, solidarity, god-forsaken, never alone, unjust, unique, salvation, unstoppable love, forgiveness, sacrifice.

What does the cross mean to you? During this Lenten season we will be exploring that question. And the question is as important as any answers we find, because there is no one right answer.

The cross is both something we seek to understand, and also something we experience. I believe all of us are capable of understanding the cross, and I believe that the cross is a symbol that can give deep meaning to our faith and life. My hope is that after this Lenten season, you will come to a greater understanding of what the cross means to you and to church.

Each week we will dig deeper into what the cross means. In addition to our time in worship on Sundays and Wednesdays our confirmation ministry has made a cross for each household in our congregations. These will be handed out on Ash Wednesday and the following Sunday. Each week in Lent you will receive another symbol to add to your cross to assist us in keeping the focus on the Cross.




Lutefisk Dinner Preparation Schedule


will have a special candlelight dinner! Whether you are looking for a

Youth News – On-line Safety

The WAY (Westby Area Youth) is the joint ministry of OSLC and Westby Coon Prairie and is lead by Michelle Engh—Director of Faith Formation at WCP and Pastor John from OSLC/Skogdalen.

Our youth are busy with many things these days--and one way to connect is through social media. As adults, we are warned about the threat of identity theft and precautions to take while shopping on line. Our youth are also at risk: of cyberbullying and of predators.



Recently, a group of students and I *"googled"* ourselves. They were very surprised about the information that was out on line already about

them.....from images to addresses. Comments were made along the lines of "that's creepy!!!"

I also realize that parents may not be familiar with some of the apps and sites out there, so thought I would include that in this issue of the Witness/Parish Paper. Have you ever "googled" your youth? I recommend doing this with your youth---so that you have the opportunity to talk with them about what is posted online about them and their safety. Here are some ideas for discussing safety on line:

- Make sure your child understands that once they post something online, it doesn't go away. And they can lose control over it. It can be shared and even altered by others. Even deleting something doesn't necessarily remove it from the Internet.
- Help your child to think before posting. Kids can be very impulsive about snapping photos and uploading them to share with friends, or posting personal information. But once it's online, anything can take on a life of its own and be impossible to take back. Rule of thumb: only post what they'd be comfortable with anyone (especially parents) seeing.
- Talk to your child about what a real friend is. It's not uncommon for kids to see the number of friends they have in their social networks as a symbol of their importance or popularity. But they need to understand that in the online space, you can never be 100 per cent sure of who you're talking to. Encourage them not to accept friends they've never met in person.

- Help them understand it's important to be true to their values to be a 'good person' online – and avoid saying things online they wouldn't say to someone's face. Gossiping about others, or using mocking, sarcastic language online may increase a child's chance of being bullied themselves.
- Talk with your child about self-respect, particularly as it relates to sharing intimate photos of themselves with a girlfriend or boyfriend.

There are a lot of new sites out there beyond **Facebook**, **Twitter** and **Snap-chat**. Some like **Tinder** are a match-making (hook-up) mobile app that identifies other **Tinder** users in a specific radius for a user to view and potentially contact. The age requirement is 13. **MeetMe** is a social network where users can find others nearby to chat....again the age requirement is 13. **Omegle** is a free chat website that randomly pairs users in one-to-one chat sessions where they can chat anonymously both by text or video-chat. There is no age requirement. **TheDirty.com** is a website where users can post photos and rumors about celebrities and people they see on the street as well as classmates. There is no age requirement.

I am not saying these sites are necessarily bad sites---but encouraging 13 year olds to hookup is a concern for child safety. Discuss with your youth the sites and apps they use and any concerns you may have with their use.
