The 2013 Synod Assembly will be held in LaCrosse this year on April 26-27 and conclude on April 28 with local community service projects in our community. Pastor John, along with Barb Christenson and Jayne Anderson, delegates from Our Savior's, and Matt Euler, delegate from Skogdalen, will be attending the event in LaCrosse. The theme is "Generous Love-Generous Lives". On Friday evening, Tony Campolo will be speaking at a public event in the LaCrosse Center, North Hall. If you are interested in attending, contact Pastor John or the church office for your free ticket. Each church is asked to bring a congregational offering for Saturday morning that will be divided among ELCA Malaria Campaign, Sembrando Project in Peru (provides healthy meals for school children, along with tutoring and health and faith education), and Synod budget. Our Savior's will be taking up a special offering on Sunday, April 21, at the 10:30 service to support this assembly request. On Sunday, April 28th, there will be various community projects in the Westby community in conjunction with Westby Coon Prairie Lutheran Church and Vang Lutheran Church.

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SKOGDALEN COUNCIL MEETING

Present: Annette, Jan, Lisa, Bob, Gary, Terry, Richard, Marilyn, Rhonda and Pastor John.

Meeting was called to order at 6:05 p.m. by President Annette McHenry. Secretary's report was given by Jan and Treasurer's report was given by Lisa. She noted a balance at the end of February of \$11,257.51. Motion wad made and carried to approve both reports as presented.

Church insurance comes due in mid-April. Cost is \$1,675.00. A couple

of other companies were looked into but their rates were considerably higher. Mark Anderson is working with Acuity, our present carrier, to see if there are any ways to lower the cost.

Offering envelops were discussed. Do we continue to order for everyone even though many people don't use their envelopes? It was decided to continue doing so. Lisa will order them right away as there is a 10% discount if ordered by March 29th. She also asked for and received permission to start paying Archie and Jan quarterly instead of semi-annually. Question was raised whether there was an increase in giving after the letter went out. Mostly no, with the exception of one giving unit.

Regarding the molding, Richard had looked at two different prices of pine and two of oak. Motion was carried to go with the oak and cost not to exceed \$200.00. Richard will purchase the molding and he and Bob will do the work.

Synod Assembly will be April 26th -28th. OS and WCP will have a joint service that day with clergy exchanges so that Pastor Dennis Hallemeier will lead worship here that day. In the afternoon, there will be some joint community service projects. It was suggested that we could have our spring clean-up day at that time. Our next meeting will be Sunday, April 21st after church with the balcony clean-up. Meeting adjourned.

Received and accepted the secretaries and treasure's reports

Discussed the article "Six Suggestions for Church Leadership" which focused on need to rethink how we do ministry in the 21st century.

Discussed the retreat for council members on March 16th at WCP. Pastor John asked that members bring 4 hats. The retreat will focus on the mission, ministry, and structure of Jesus' ministry at OSLC

Wally, Melissa, Pastor John and Georgi attended Bethel Home Annual Meeting. They reported that they are financially stable.

The MOOS club will be compensating the youth who helped with Lutefisk dinner.

Synod Assembly weekend is April 26, 27 & 28. Pastor John has tickets available for the Friday night event. Jayne and Barb will be our representatives on Saturday.

There will be a joint service with WCP at 8:00 am held at Our Savior's on Syttende Mai Sunday May $19^{\rm th}$

Stewardship Committee members are reading the book "The Great Permission" which looks at stewardship as more than money. They are also looking into ways to attract younger adults to come to church.

The decorating committee is authorized to use the Lillian Leum memorial fund to furnish the office area.

Worship and Evangelism Committee reminded us that there will be a guest pastor from Food for the Poor leading worship the first Sunday in April.

The food tent outside in the back of the church during Syttende Mai will be operated by the youth. This is mainly a fund raiser for high school youth for mission trips.

Wally presented report on our Synod giving listing where our gifts went too. There will be a special offering taken prior to the Synod assembly with the funds designated for the synod Anti-Malaria campaign and other special ministries.

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SKOGDALEN WELCA

The Skogdalen WELCA met on Saturday, March 2nd at 10:00 a.m.

We have two benefits this weekend. We will donate a quilt to the Evers Benefit and the Kinserdahl Benefit.

The Lord's Prayer was said and the Table Prayer was sung. Today we all brought our t-shirts and we made lovely scarves out of them. The Secretaries Report was read by Lynette Johnson and it was accepted as read. Hildur Devine then gave the Treasurers Report and it was accepted as read.

New Business: Karen Hankee was invited to share the estimates that she had gotten concerning the kitchen island remodeling. There was much discussion after the estimates were presented and voting followed after what was available for funds and what would be feasible. The designated kitchen funds from the WELCA account totaled \$2755.00, the cookbook account has \$2754.07 totaling \$5509. Breaking down the bill by way of electrical, plumbing, and carpentry meant using different contractors. The final bids went to Mike Geary for electrical totaling \$500.00, plumbing went to Y-tri for \$1200, and carpentry went to Hall Construction for the cabinets and moving of sink positions for the amount of \$2700 because the existing framework could be used. All this work will be accomplished in a four day time frame over the weekend of April 5th to April 8th. Adding up the figures bring the total cost to \$4400. The daycare has been informed of the project for meal planning. The Rachel Circle had a program planned but due to the time factor discussing the remodeling project Lynette Johnson abbreviated her sharing of the history behind Daylight Saving Time and St. Patrick's Day. While the collection was taken Betty Homstad played some familiar music and the Table Grace was sung before The Lord's Prayer was said. The month of April has the Sarah Circle doing the program and Norma Bekkum and Shirley Aarness are the Serving Hostesses.

Nursery

Give Kathy a call at 637.2559 One of the most important things for visitors and members who have infants and young children is to provide the option of a Sunday Morning nursery. Children are always welcomed in worship yet sometimes there is the need to worship without worrying about the needs of a young one. For this to become a reality at OSLC we need a number of people to assist in coordinating a nursery.

Daycare Contract Update

There have been many questions that have surfaced in the last few months regarding the daycare (WDCLC) at OSLC. Over the past year and a half, OSLC and WDCLC have worked together to write a new contract, since the last signed contract was over 10 years old. A daycare committee consisting of OSLC members was created.

After reviewing the old contract, the committee quickly realized that there were many items that were out of date and needed attention. The committee talked to many different groups in the church to see what their needs and concerns were, regarding space and use of the church. We also worked closely with WDCLC to see what their needs and concerns were. The main concern with OSLC members was the lack of space for the different church groups that use the church. Another concern was that the amount of money paid to OSLC by WDCLC was not sufficient considering the amount of space that was being used. After much consideration, a new contract was written and eventually approved by both OSLC and WDCLC. This new contract started on January 1st of 2013 and is in effect for 12 months. At that time it will be reviewed again and if both sides agree, will be signed for another 12 months. Below are a few of the major differences between the old and new contracts.

WDCLC no longer uses any of the space in the upstairs of the church. Because of this, WDCLC did have to reduce the maximum students they can enroll.

WDCLC now has use of two classrooms, an office, the old food pantry room for storage and the closet under the stairs, all located in the basement of the church. They also have use of the north side of the fellowship hall from the women's bathroom to the wall. They no longer have storage space anywhere else in the church. They also have use of the kitchen as well as limited cupboard and refrigerator space in the kitchen.

Sunday school has access to all the classrooms in the basement for Sunday school classes.

Even with the reduced space, their rent was increased from \$950/month to \$1500/month. The daycare committee and WDCLC will meet quarterly to discuss the relationship and work out problems or concerns.
