

**December 6th - 8th
Racine, Wisconsin**

This event is sponsored by the Social Work Program at Carthage College (Pastor John's daughter Marya is coordinating the project) and is designed to provide youth and adults the opportunity to explore the realities of being homeless in our state. We will be working with The Hospitality Center of Racine by assisting in preparing meals, interacting with the people who participate in the ministry, and learning about homelessness and poverty. We will be staying at an Episcopal Church, eating at the Hospitality Center, visiting Carthage College, worshipping at an African American Church and more. Cost is \$35 which includes transportation, meals and programs. This is for 8th graders and above. Registration forms can be picked up at the church office.




High School Retreats


